MAUNDY THURSDAY APRIL 6, 2023

(Thursday of the Mandatum, Latin for "commandment")



With nightfall and the beginning of this service, our Lenten observance comes to its culmination. We gather with Christians around the world in celebrating the Three Days of Jesus' death and resurrection. Our remembering is more than a retracing of the last days of Jesus' life. Rather, throughout these Three Days, through word, sacrament, and ritual, we participate in the saving power of Jesus' Passover from death to life. As the Three Days begin, we are invited to glory in the cross of Christ - our salvation, our life, our resurrection.

On this night we hear Jesus' new commandment (*mandatum*) to love one another. As Jesus washed the feet of his disciples, we are called to follow his example, living out our baptismal vocation with humility and care for one another, especially for the poor and the unloved.

We gather around the Lord's Table to remember the sacrifice of Jesus' life. His love was revealed in the emptying of his life for us. We share the holy meal, inspiring us to become what we eat and drink: the body of Christ, offering ourselves in love for the life of the world.

We depart in silence, ready to continue the celebration of the Three Days on Good Friday.




